TOM HAZLETON in concert Sunday, OCTOBER 19, at 4:00 P.M. Fallbrook United Methodist Church

The largest 3 manual Allen Renaissance digital organ in San Diego County will be presented in an inaugural concert by world-renowned organist TOM HAZLETON at Fallbrook United Methodist Church, 1844 Winter Haven Rd., in Fallbrook. The concert is being co-sponsored by the Palomar Chapter, American Guild of Organists, Organ Stop, Inc. and the church. Tom will play Bach's Passacaglia and Fugue, works by Handel, Elmore, Lang, the Allegro from Vierne's 2nd Symphony, contemporary hymn arrangements and his own improvisations. A free will offering will be accepted for the organ fund.

Tom Hazleton
"A Master of the King of In-

struments," according to the Los Angeles Times...
"Magical, Marvelous, Musical in every best way", stated Michael Barone of Minnesota Public Radio. The review of the 2002 ATOS convention hailed Tom as the best overall keyboard artist alive today. Thomas Hazleton is considered to be one of the few concert organists equally at home at the console of classical and theatre organs.

As a leading recording artist, Hazleton has over 50 LP's, cassette tapes and compact discs to his credit. All have received critical acclaim by the public and critics alike.

Tom was named "Organist of the Year" by the American Theatre Organ Society.

Hazleton is a graduate of San Francisco State University, and received an artist diploma from The Curtis Institute of Philadelphia. He also studied with, and was assistant to the famed Richard Purvis of Crace Cathedral, San Francis o. Tom has performed on most major classical and theatre organs the world over. Included have been Grace Cathedr: I, San Francisco, Balboa P: rk, San Diego, Crystal Cathe dral, Garden Grove, Wanam: ker Store, Philadelphia, Riversi de Church, New York City, and most major theatre organs, here and abroad.

Tom presently resides in San Diego, and continues to concertize and act as a design consultant for church and theatre organs.

The Protégé C-6 is from Allen's "Chamber Series" line of church instruments. It offers 2 manuals and 27 speaking stops. This installation includes four H-15 tone cabinets powered by a 120 watt amplifier.

The C-6 replaces an Allen

202C Digital Computer Organ which served for thirty years. Upgrades include state of the art sampled sound, DSP tone generation, Virtual Acoustics, Programmable Memory and MIDI. You will be amazed at the variety and power of this instrument.

Avilable Now!!! Allen Custom Classic II by L. Phelps



This fine instrument was built by the Custom Organs Division of the Allen Organ Company in 1987. It is a digital copy of a tracker pipe organ Lawrence Phelps built for Hexham Abbey in London, England. With 34 classically voiced stops playing through 14 independent audio channels this is the ultimate in clear, neo-baroque sound.

The drawknob console features reverse color keyboards with simulated tracker touch. It has been upgraded with MIDI.
